IMPORTANT INFORMATION

INTENDED USE

The device is intended for producing holes with soil to allow oxygen to the roots and the soil to breathe. Also ideal for preparing for seed and top dressing.

THE MACHINE

SUPPLIED AS STANDARD

Instruction Manual, Aerator Frame, Spring Tines X5, Tool

ASSEMBLY

- Lift the Aerator from the carton.
- The Aerator will be complete, however for transit it will be folded in two.
- Unfold the top handle from the lower section of the Aerator
- Tighten the two wing nuts, located on the outside of the Aerator on both sides.
- Your Aerator is now ready to use.

OPERATION



DANGER

The product must only be put into operation if no defects are found. It is crucial that any defective parts are replaced before the product is used again.

Check the safety equipment and the safe condition of the product:

- Check whether the hopper is empty.
 - Check all parts to make sure that they fit tightly.
 - Check whether there are any visible defects: broken parts, cracks, etc.
-
- Depress aerator into the lawn with pressure on cross bar with your foot.
 - Cores will be pushed into core collection box when you next insert tines into the lawn.
 - Empty collection box into wheelbarrow or suitable receptacle.
 - Fill holes produced with suitable top dressing.

NB. It is recommended that you lightly water the ground in dry conditions to reduce the amount of pressure required.

NUMBER OF TINES REQUIRED

Five tines will push into most types of lawn. However, if you find the lawn is too hard, some tines can easily be removed to make lawn penetration easier. Using the supplied spanner, loosen the nut in the collection tray, by rotating anti-clockwise until the tine is removed. Store in a safe place, for future usage.

CLEANING

CLEANING THE DEVICE

- Careful handling and regular cleaning ensure that the device will remain functional & powerful for a long time.
- Brush off coarse dirt.
- Wipe down the device with a slightly damp cloth.
- Never spray the device with water or subject it to water.
- To clean, never use cleansers or solvents. This can cause irreparable damage to the device. The plastic parts can be eaten away by the chemicals.
- The spike on your supplied spanner can be used to clear soil from the tine inner.

WARNING

Make sure that unauthorised persons do not have access to the device!

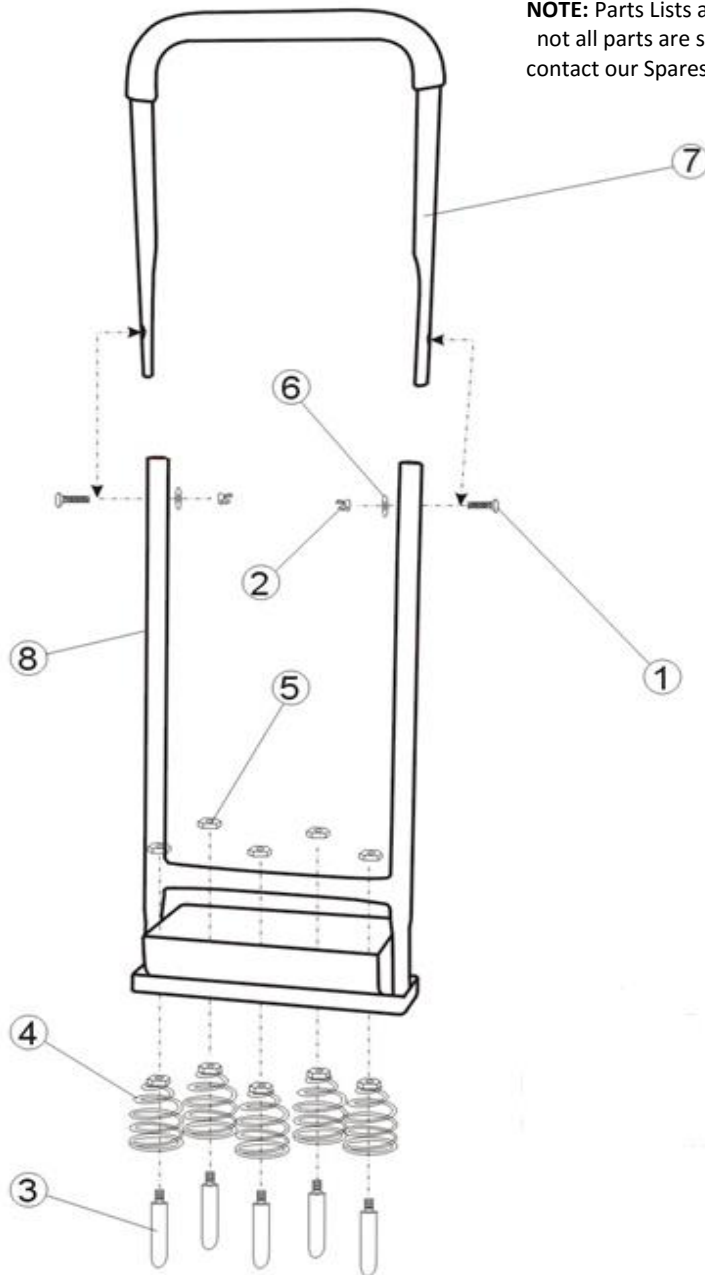
- Store the product in a dry place.

90 days from the original date of purchase for Replacement Spare Parts (unless normal wear & tear component, which are covered for 30 days).

All machines' must be serviced within the first 12 months from the original date of purchase to comply with the warranty, failure to do so will invalidate the 2nd year of the warranty.

All Handy, Handy Pro (All others), Mowerland and Q-Garden domestic products.

1 year from the original date of sale to the first domestic user.

90 days from the original date of sale to the professional/commercial user.

90 days from the original date of sale when used for hire.

A reduced warranty period of 90 days applies to those items which are subject to normal wear and tear (e.g. wheels, tyres, cutter bars, cylinders, bottom blades, belts, cables, collection bags, spark plugs).

Engines as per the manufacturer's warranty statement which will be supplied with the machine.

90 days from the original date of purchase for Replacement Spare Parts (unless normal wear & tear component, which are covered for 30 days).
